

Information about GDPR

In May 2018 GDPR also became a part of Norwegian law. It is applicable to all companies operating in the EU. The aim of these regulations is to protect all EU citizens from privacy and data breaches in today's data-driven world.

What is personal data?

Personal data is any information which relates to any living individual or the collection of information which together can lead to the identification of a particular person. For example, name, age, address, telephone number, e-mail address, IP address, car registration number, photos, fingerprint and ID number.

GDPR has six cases where it is possible to use personal data, and four of them are applicable to companies.

1. The registered person has given the company permission
2. It is necessary for the company to fulfil the terms of a contract with the registered person.
3. It is necessary in order to follow the rules and regulations
4. The company has a legitimate interest in this data which is absolutely necessary and more important than protecting the personal data of the registered person.

Why does Ranheim Paper & Board AS have access to personal data?

Ranheim Paper & Board AS needs this data in order to administer and fulfill terms of contracts. We work continually to identify risks to personal data and carry out the necessary measures to make sure we have met the required demands of the regulations.

What does this mean for our business partners?

We have information about our customers and suppliers. E-mails and business cards contain personal information. This information is not distributed to any third party. We delete personal data once it is no longer necessary for the purpose for which it was intended.

Principles surrounding personal data

Sensitive data including dates of birth and ID numbers is not shared on non-secure e-mails.

Personal data is deleted or made anonymous when it is no longer needed, or if the customer/supplier requests this.

Ranheim Paper & Board AS is responsible for assessing safety risks and confidentiality with regard to data protection. It is important to us that the information we have is treated in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations.
